DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER BY SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

TAB 1 Lisa Ann Brodhead-Farris, R.R.T., DOH Case No: 2009-12547

Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members – Sherrod, Nunez)

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel. Ms. Sherrod was recused from this case due to participation on the probable cause panel that considered this case.

Ms. Smith summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(aa), Florida Statutes (2008) by testing positive for any drug, as defined in s. 112.0455, on any confirmed pre-employment or employer-ordered drug screening when the practitioner does not have a lawful prescription and legitimate medical reason for using the drug.

Current costs are \$3,500.58

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Fine of \$500.00 to be paid within four (4) years of the filing of the order
- Costs to be paid within four (4) years of the filing of the order
- License shall be suspended until such time as the Respondent petitions and appears before the Board and proves that she is safe to practice respiratory care in the State of Florida. Proof of competence shall include, at a minimum, an evaluation by the Professional Respiratory Network (PRN). During the period of suspension, Respondent shall in no way participate in the delivery of respiratory care services.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud moved to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Fields and carried 5/0.

TAB 2 Stephanie Lynn Nichols, R.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-02201
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members – Barrett, Nunez)

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel. Mr. Barrett was recused from this case due to participation on the probable cause panel that considered this case.

Ms. Smith summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(x), Florida Statutes (2006) by failing to report to the board, or the department if there is no board, in writing within 30 days after the licensee has been convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in any jurisdiction.

Current costs are \$583.91

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Fine of \$300.00 to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the order

MOTION: Ms. Sherrod made a motion to adopt the findings of fact and conclusions of law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and that this constitutes a violation of the Florida Statutes, as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- \$1,000.00 fine to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order

Proof of competence to return to the practice of respiratory care shall include, at a minimum, an evaluation by the Professional Resource Network.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PERSONAL APPEARANCE PURSUANT TO §456.013(3)(c), F.S.

TAB 12 Steven Lionel Bernhard, Certified Respiratory Therapist

Mr. Bernhard was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Bernhard was notified on January 26, 2010 to make a personal appearance at the April 9, 2010 general board meeting to discuss the answers given in the criminal history section of his application, however, he failed to appear.

The Board tabled his application and a "Notice of Personal Appearance Required" was issued May 6, 2010. It states: "Pursuant to Section 456.013(3)(c), Florida Statutes, the Board of Respiratory Care voted to require Mr. Bernhard to make a personal appearance before the Board at its next regularly scheduled meeting on July 16, 2010, or the application for licensure will be denied."

Mr. Bernhard did not appear at the July 16, 2010, meeting. He sent a letter stating that he would not be appearing, would like to withdraw his application, and requested a refund of refundable fees.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Hendriksen made a motion to deny Mr. Bernhard licensure due to non-appearance. The motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried 5/0.

TAB 13 Vincent Paul DeFelice, Registered Respiratory Therapist

He was requested to appear before the board due to answering "yes" in the criminal, personal, and disciplinary history sections of his application.

If PRN advocates that she is safe to practice respiratory care, license will be granted. Should PRN determine the Applicant is not safe to practice, the license will be denied.

- Can work in Hospital setting only
- Must submit quarterly reports by supervisor or manager, to include assessment of documentation, timeliness and attendance, overall behavior, non-critical care setting only
- After one (1) year, applicant must make an appearance before the board at a regularly scheduled board meeting to review progress.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Fields and carried 5/0.

She was requested to appear before the board due to answering “yes” in the criminal history and disciplinary history sections of her application.

The board office is currently developing and will soon transition into the online application. One of our goals is to become as paperless as possible without compromising the validity of the information received.
