MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER AFTER HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT

Informal Hearing, (PCP Members – Fields, Weiss)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Sykes summarized the case for the Board. - Rules Report

Ms. Patterson presented the following rules report to the Board.

- 64B32-2.001 License by Endorsement

Development published on September 30, 2011.

- 64B32-6.001 Continuing Education Requirements

Proposed change to 64B32-6.001(4): A licensee who ~~also~~ holds a current license as a Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) or holds a current license in another health care profession, may satisfy the continuing education requirement for ~~a renewal issuance of this~~ the Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) or renewal of the CRT license with hours counted toward renewal of another license, as long as the hours meet all the requirements of this rule chapter.

This will allow continuing education credits be awarded to both CRT and RRT licensure renewal.

Proposed Changes to 64B32-6.001(5): Ms. Sherrod suggested 2 hours be required for laws and rules course credit. The Board Counsel was asked to research whether the Board has authority to require this course for initial licensure.

Rule language should be modified to specify course is required beginning with the 2013-2015 biennium. Ms. Sherrod asked Mr. Dennis Willerth, Executive Director with the Florida Society for Respiratory Care, for input on the start of the proposal.

Technical changes for 64B32-5.001 have been made and were published on September 30, 2011 to correct language by Department of State.

Technical changes have also been made throughout 64B32-1, 64B32-5, and 64B32-6 of existing rules and published on September 16, 2011.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Sherrod made a motion to accept the requirement of laws and rules course credit to be two (2) hours, amend the proposed language for 64B32-6.001(5), adding the start date beginning with the June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2015 biennium. The motion was seconded by Mr. Killion and carried 5/0.

Members will submit suggestions to the Board office for course outline and the Board's Education liaison with assist with the course guideline.

TAB 26 Board Chair, Bayyinah Margaret Sherrod
