

CALHOUN C.I. SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

For CMA Survey Conducted APRIL 15-18, 2003

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH SURVEY FINDINGS REQUIRING OHS INTERVENTION

In addition to the survey findings of Calhoun C.I. referenced in the body of the survey report (which fall within the scope of the institutional staff to correct), there was one further area of concern related to physical health. This finding is based on standards adopted by the CMA, but not addressed in OHS policy, procedure, or directive, or on other issues beyond institutional control. Therefore, corrective actions at the institutional level can be initiated only by or with the authority or intervention of the OHS.

The items listed below identify the finding, the name of the audit instrument used by the CMA surveyors and the specific screen number, if applicable, and what criteria were used to determine the standard was not met.

MENTAL HEALTH

There were no mental health findings requiring OHS intervention at Calhoun C.I.

PHYSICAL HEALTH

1. **All inmates, even in isolation or segregation, are given the opportunity to exercise at least one hour a day, five times a week.** The standard is referenced in the CMA Preventative Care System Audit Instrument, Screen 5 and is based on national healthcare standards
