

HILLSBOROUGH C.I. SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

For CMA Survey Conducted May 7-9, 2002

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH SURVEY FINDINGS REQUIRING OHS INTERVENTION

In addition to the survey findings of Hillsborough C.I. referenced in the main body of the survey report (which fall within the scope of the institutional staff to correct), there was one further area of concern related to physical health. These findings are based on standards adopted by the CMA, but not addressed in OHS policy, procedure, or directive, or on other issues beyond institutional control. Therefore, corrective actions at the institutional level can be initiated only by or with the authority or intervention of the OHS.

The items listed below identify the finding, the name of the audit instrument used by the CMA surveyors and the specific screen number, if applicable, and what criteria were used to determine the standard was not met.

PHYSICAL HEALTH

1. **Peer review had not been conducted for the CHO or Dentist.** The standard is referenced in the CMA Administrative System Audit Instrument, Screen 12, and is based on national correctional health care standards and prevailing professional practices in the community at large.

MENTAL HEALTH

There were no OHS findings specifically related to mental health.
