

Tuberculosis Morbidity, Florida 2010



Fact Sheet

In 2010, 835 tuberculosis cases were reported in Florida. This represents a two percent (1.7%) increase in cases since 2009 (821). The TB case rate in 2010 remained the same as in 2009 at 4.4 per 100,000 population.

- Excess alcohol use w/in past year 15% (122/835)
- HIV Co-infection 12% (103/835)
- Illicit drug use within past year 10% (82/835)
- Homelessness 6% (52/835)
- Incarcerated at diagnosis 3% (26/835)

Drug Resistance

- Resistant to Isoniazid 4% (19/491)*
- Resistant to Isoniazid and Rifampin (MDR) 1% (4/491)*
